## ***George Chamber of Commerce Member Dues Structure***

### **Membership Yearly Rates**

Chamber dues are paid annually and due January 1 of each year.

Dues not paid by April 1 will be assessed a \$5 per month finance charge.

New start-up George businesses will receive a complimentary first year of membership.

\*\*\*Number of employees is based on full-time employees at 40 hours/week with part-time employees pro-rated based on hours worked per week. Number of employees is based on employees per EIN.

(Examples: 2 @ 20 hours/week employees = 1 full-time employee  
or 4 @ 10 hours/week employees = 1 full-time employee.)

#### **Classification I**

Store front retail, office,  
manufacturing, or service/non-profit business,  
including healthcare organizations.

**Businesses with 11 or more employees.**

**\$250.00/business**

(Voting privileges with  
maximum of 10 votes per business.)

#### **Classification II**

Store front retail, office,  
manufacturing, or service business.

**Businesses with 6-10 employees.**

**\$150/business**

(Voting privileges with  
1 vote per \$25 paid in dues.)

#### **Classification III**

Store front retail, office,  
manufacturing, or service business.

**Businesses with 1-5 employees.**

**\$75/business**

(Voting privileges with  
1 vote per \$25 paid in dues.)

#### **Classification IV**

Sales representatives, manufacturer's rep, or  
individual sales personnel, usually operating out of  
residence.

**\$25/individual**

(Has voting privilege of 1 vote.)

#### **Classification V**

Local Community & Civic Organizations &  
Education

(ie: Kiwanis, Betterment Club, etc.)

**\$25/organization**

(No voting privileges.)

#### **Classification VI**

Associate membership for individuals – teacher,  
minister, retired business people and/or employees,  
community member

**\$10/individual**

(No voting privileges.)

Majority of chamber members fall in Class I, II, or III.
